The American Council for Québec Studies in collaboration with the North Carolina Chapter of the American Association of Teachers of French and Davidson College invites you to a one-day workshop on teaching Québec studies. The goal is to present contemporary Québec society, culture, and literature in order to encourage high school and college teachers to include Québec and French-Canadian content in their courses. Speakers will explore the history, politics, language, cinema, and literature of Québec, distribute teachable texts, and offer information on resources available from the Québec government and various academic organizations. Panel speakers will include Professor Carole Kruger of Davidson College, Professor Jane Moss of Duke University, and Professor Olivia Choplin of Elon University. Frédéric Tremblay, Director of the Québec Government's Washington DC Office will make opening remarks and Professor Patrick Leroux of Concordia University will give a luncheon talk on "Le cirque québécois: son histoire, ses tendances et son impact sur la société."

Participants should register by October 27. There will be a \$5 registration fee to cover the cost of materials, but no charge for coffee, refreshments, and the luncheon.
